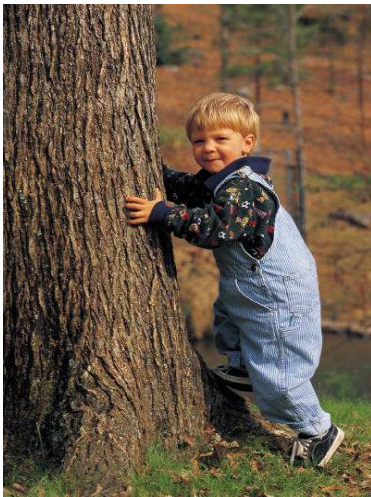


SPECIAL MINI-CONFERENCE: Sensory Integration and Activities
